COVID-19 UPDATE

What we are doing:

- All employees and visitors entering our offices will be screened for COVID-19 symptoms and possible exposure

 Business travel remains restricted to essential travel only.


What you can do:

HURRICANE SEASON

June 1st marked the start of the 2020 Hurricane season and this will once again test our patience. Don't put away your COVID-19 supplies just yet. Continue to stock up on the basics; water, batteries, non-perishable foods and medication.

As always, hurricane season runs from June 1st to November 30th. Regardless of how many times we have "braved the storm", there is always that one that caught us off guard. Don't underestimate the power of the storm, whether a Tropical Storm, Category 1 or 4 Hurricane. Each imparts its own hazards that we need to be prepared for.

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) announced the 2020 Hurricane outlook on May 21.

"NOAA's Climate Prediction Center is forecasting a likely range of 13 to 19 named storms (winds of 39 mph or higher), of which 6 to 10 could become hurricanes (winds of 74 mph or higher), including 3 to 6 major hurricanes (category 3, 4 or 5; with winds of 111 mph or higher). NOAA provides these ranges with a 70% confidence. An average hurricane season produces 12 named storms, of which 6 become hurricanes, including 3 major hurricanes."

Hurricane safety and preparedness is critical, most importantly we need to have everything in place before the season begins. Don't get caught off guard, be prepared. Start now.
